FORMER U.S. AMATEUR CHAMPIONS PLAY IN RARE
MATCH TOGETHER AT QUAIL RIDGE COUNTRY CLUB
TO RAISE MONEY FOR BETHESDA

BOYNTON BEACH, Fla. -- Quail Ridge Country Club in Boynton Beach, Fla., recently staged a rare golf exhibition that included four former U.S. Amateur champions who helped raise \$12,500 for Bethesda Healthcare System.

Former U.S. Amateur champions Vinny Giles (1972) and John Harris (1993), representing Quail Ridge, scored a 3-and-2 victory over the Delray Dunes team of Bob Murphy (1965) and Jay Sigel (1982, 1983). The exhibition was staged January 26, the same day as legendary Sam Snead and Dr. Bob Harris (John's dad) were inducted into the Quail Ridge Sports Hall of Fame.

Quail Ridge has been one of the biggest supporters of its neighbor Bethesda Hospital, donating more than \$7 million to benefit the hospital's Center for Radiation Oncology and the Bethesda Heart Hospital. More than \$4 million of the \$7 million has come from the 27-year Quail Ridge Country Club Day of Golf annual event.
